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
“The Danger Gang” by Tom Fletcher


“Black Brother, Black Brother” by Jewell Parker Rhodes

With a heart-wrenching fairy-tale ending, this incredible true story is brought to life by Victoria's stunning illustrations.




“I Am The Minotaur” by Anthony McGowan

“How To Save The World With A Chicken And An Egg” by Emma Shevah


Ivy can talk to animals – really – but no one will believe her. This is incredibly frustrating, especially as she is so passionate about the environment and helping wildlife.



“Dare To Be You” by Matthew Syed



What would you dare to try if you stopped worrying about fitting in?
