WHY PLAY A MUSICAL INSTRUMENT?

Making music is a great way for children to be creative and it also requires them to think quickly and express themselves. Playing a musical instrument teaches children how to manage information, and problem solve, and to be adaptable when working collaboratively with others. It is a great way to make friends and work towards a finished product like performing in the end of year concerts.

The Lincolnshire Music Service (LMS) are offering our students the following lessons:

- strings: violin, viola, cello, double bass, harp
- woodwind: flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, saxophone, recorder
- brass: trumpet, cornet, trombone, baritone, euphonium, horn (French and tenor), tuba
- percussion: drum kit, tuned percussion,
- guitar: classical, electric and bass
- keyboard
- vocal/singing

There are flexible payment plans available and discounts for free school meals students and looked after children. Lessons start from £3.10 for a 20-minute shared lesson.
