Research has shown that students who read at home for

are exposed to

### I.8 million words

per year! This leads to a wider vocabulary which can be used in all subjects at school and beyond. There is also a clear link between reading age and achievement.

Reading is shown to relax us. Perhaps consider reading for 20 minutes before bed and avoid screen time. It will help your literacy skills and have a calming effect! Why not create a new healthy habit?

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## **TIPS TO ENJOY READING**

Try the book version of a film/ TV show you like! Ask a friend or family member for recommendations. Choose books about a topic that interests you.

Do a buddy read choose a book with a friend and both read it!

Read a magazine, newspaper or blog. Download a book app like Goodreads or The Storygraph.
