





















Sporting Achievements

As part of their transition to secondary school, year 6 pupils from The West Grantham Primary Academy have taken part in a Humanities' Day at the academy. They liked looking at the information and books about The Mayans and The Aztecs and sharing what they found out. They loved making their own pizza rolls and being able to cook altogether. All Things Science

Wow, what a busy term in science!

Year 7 have settled into their science lessons and are really enjoying using the scientific equipment. This term they have learnt about cells and space. Year 8 meanwhile have been doing lots of 'shocking' experiments in their topics of electricity and magnetism. They have also learnt how to mix chemicals safetly during their topic of chemical reactions. Year 9 have spent the term learning about the very topical subject of the atmosphere, including global warming, carbon footprint and renewable energy sources.

In KS4, year 10 have covered the topics of digestion, ions and density in the subjects of biology, chemistry and physics. All of these topics have provided opportunities for practical work allowing the students a greater understanding of how science works. Year 11 have been working really hard in preparing for their mock exams at the end of this term.

Our Wednesday afterschool club and Friday enrichment continue to be very popular with students as they explore science through more practical and investigative work outside of their lessons.

Year 9 students visited BGB and Pentangle during National Manufacturing Week. Both manufacturing firms support our GCSE students in years 10 and 11 by offering practical lessons on their sites. This option is a very popular choice every year, and we are sure the year 9 students who visited them this term will be keen to choose engineering as an option in year 10.

After sampling their rations, students tried on various pieces of equipment. A great day and one of the highlights of our careers programme.



Christmas 2025


